### Welcome from Helen Hier

It is a privilege to teach at St. Clare's and to be able to contribute to my first newsletter before I take on the role of Headteacher after the half term break.

I have worked at St. Clare's as a Spanish teacher for fifteen years. I have also been a member of the Senior Leadership Team for ten years and Deputy Head for the last five years. I have thoroughly enjoyed all of my time at St Clare's but the last five years have been particularly enjoyable, as I have been involved in developing the Teaching & Learning at the school. I am very much looking forward to continuing with this work as Headteacher.

One of the strengths of St. Clare's is that being a small school, you get to know all of the pupils. My time at St. Clare's has been predominantly in the senior school, and although I already know many of the Prep School children, I am looking forward to spending more time with them.

As a language teacher, I am passionate about the teaching and learning of modern foreign languages. Teaching a child a foreign language at an early age results in better fluency than if they learn later in life. Developmentally their brains are ready

to learn a foreign language and fluency comes easily, rapidly and without accent. Learning a language will also improve their problem solving and critical thinking skills and improve their memory.

After half term, each class from Nursey to Year 6 will have one lesson of Spanish a week. I will teach their first class, as this will allow me to learn all of their names, and to get to know a little more about each of them. Ultimately, I hope that as many of the children as possible will become excited and enthused about learning a modern foreign language.

I am delighted to announce that after the half term break, Mrs Cheverton will be returning to join the Modern Foreign Language Department at St. Clare's. Mrs Cheverton was my teaching replacement during my maternity leave. She is a gifted linguist and an experienced and talented teacher. We are very much looking forward to her return. Mrs Cheverton will be responsible for the delivery of language teaching in the Prep School.

There are many exciting developments ahead for St. Clare's over the next few years. One such development is our new **Enrichment Programme**. Within the Senior School, we are in the process of developing an extra-curricular and enrichment programme for a Wednesday afternoon. The structure of the week has been changed slightly, so that curriculum and teaching time will remain the same, but on a Wednesday afternoon we will be working with external agencies such as **BushCraft, Duke of Edinburgh, John Muir Trust, St. John's Ambulance** and many others, so that the pupils can pursue an interest or achieve a skills based qualification. The programme of activities will be sent to parents later in the Summer Term in preparation for September.

The Prep School will also be planning **Enrichment Days** similar to the Senior School throughout the academic year and their after school extra-curricular activities will resume in September.

Finally, I would like to thank Mr Antwis for all he has done for St. Clare's over the last five years. I have really enjoyed working with him and we will remain good friends. He will not be a stranger to St. Clare's and he will be returning for our **Annual Prize Day** on Wednesday, 26<sup>th</sup> September. On behalf of everyone at St. Clare's, I would like to wish him every happiness and success at Akeley Wood School.

# Shell Bright Ideas winners for 3rd year

St. Clare's School are Welsh Regional Winners of Shell's "Bright Ideas Challenge"

For the third consecutive year, St Clare's Year 9 scientists are **Welsh Regional Winners**! This year the pupils have won £2,500 prize money for the school, individual prizes and a trip to London next week to compete against the other regional winners with the chance to win another £2,500. The team is called **'Straight Outta Science'**, their captain is Jaynee Winslade-Gregory and team mates are Susmita Dutta, Dylan Bebbington and Izzabel Woodward. The team's idea is based on the Seebeck effect and the pupils have to produce a 3D Model prototype when they visit the Imperial Colleges White City London next week. The hope will be that a public vote will select their idea to become UK champions.

Previously, in 2016 'Roller Squad' led by Joseph James were Welsh regional winners collecting £1500 for the Science department while in 2017 'Chipachapachino' led by Theo Quantick won £3,000 for suggesting that all newly built houses be designed to absorb carbon dioxide. They not only won the Welsh regional award, they also came 3rd across the UK.



In fact, this year we had three teams shortlisted for the final which is an incredible achievement. The two other teams who were also shortlisted were -3 **Degrees** and **We'll Think of it by Friday** for their ideas involving magnetic levitation in a vacuum and solar panels in roads.

"Seeing our ideas come to life today has been amazing. I'm excited everyone at the festival will be able see our idea on display. I hope we get lots of votes! It's been really interesting to think about real world issues that will affect how we live and see how STEM can change the world for the better. It hasn't sunk in that we are winners! Our school is going to spend the money on our science block."
