All pupils from Year 7 are taught both Spanish and French.

Spanish and French are both taught to A-Level.

All our Modern Foreign Language teachers are experienced subject specialists, many of whom are also examiners and moderators. Mme Parsons is a native French speaker.

Modern languages have always been an important part of the curriculum, but never more so than at present, when links with our European neighbours involve tourism, trade, agriculture and industry. Pupils are encouraged to develop understanding of the spoken and written forms of the language in a range of contexts.

Cur Focus on Wellbeing AT ST CLARE'S SENIOR SCHOOL

At St Clare's we believe that true success is not solely measured academically. In order for your child to achieve their full academic potential, we provide the pastoral framework for them to flourish.

Our close relationships with parents and families mean that parents can pick up the phone at any point and speak to a member of the pastoral team. Creating an environment that nurtures pupil mental health and wellbeing is a key priority for us at St Clare's School. To help us do this, we have invested in The Wellbeing Hub, developed by child and adolescent mental health and wellbeing experts, Teen Tips. We are so pleased to be able to provide this enhanced level of pastoral support.

Another additional part of our wellbeing provision is AS Tracking (Affective Social Tracking); an adolescent mental health tool that can enable schools to identify pupils' hidden risks a little bit earlier so our pastoral care becomes proactive instead of reactive, making it an invaluable extra piece to the jigsaw that is pastoral care at St Clare's.

The overriding aim at St Clare's is for pupils to achieve their full potential within our caring and supportive environment.

At KS3 (from Years 7 to 9) St Clare's pupils have an exciting and varied curriculum where they are taught the three core subjects, English Literature, English Language and Maths together with three sciences, Biology, Chemistry and Physics (all taught separately) and two foreign languages, Spanish and French. They also have lessons in Humanities, Arts, Performing Arts, PE and Computer Science as well as bespoke careers and PSE lessons.

Towards the end of KS3, pupils make their choices for **GCSE**. Our pupils study the three core subjects: English Literature, English Language and Maths and at least one science. In addition, a humanities subject and a modern foreign language are also strongly recommended to provide a broad and balanced curriculum. There is a wide choice available for you to personalise your curriculum to suit each pupil's strengths, aspirations and interests, including Business and Triple Maths from September 2023.

All pupils from Year 7 are taught Biology, Chemistry and Physics

At Key Stage 3 pupils are taught all three as completely separate subjects in our four modern, light and airy Science laboratories.

All our Science teachers are experienced subject specialists, many of whom are examiners and moderators.

Biology, Chemistry and Physics are also taught to A-Level.

Many of our Sixth Form students study all three sciences at A-Level and go on to read competitive subjects such as Medicine, Dentistry and Pharmacy at some of the top universities in UK including many in the Russell Group.





Emphasising personal growth and positive values.

Sport is a very important and well-regarded aspect of school life at St Clare's. We promote a healthy lifestyle, values of commitment, resilience, discipline, teamwork, leadership, respect, perseverance, and dedication.

From our well-loved Sports Day through to fixtures and competitive opportunities with other schools, we enjoy a sporting culture that is embraced by pupils of all ages, resulting in young people who are keen to pursue an active lifestyle when they leave us.

At St Clare's, each sport is supported by a Games specialist to ensure the very best coaching for our pupils. We are passionate about listening to our student voice and have created opportunities for girls and boys to play any sport they choose through our extensive extra-curricular programme. Mr Corsi's clubs and Mrs Bowen's clubs are open to both boys and girls.

We are very proud of the large number of pupils who perform at a regional or national level across a variety of sports. Providing support to maximise the potential of these pupils is a rewarding experience and is looked at both on the field along with providing an holistic approach to their athletic development.





A St Clare's education is about much more than just academics.

Equally important is equipping young people with the confidence and resourcefulness that prepares them to grow, thrive and find their success in a fast-changing world. That's why education extends beyond the classroom in our school. Our staff work hard to incorporate trips, excursions and other programmes (**Duke of Edinburgh Award** for example) to build critical life skills and broaden the educational experience of all our pupils.

Through 'pupil voice' and as voted by our student council, the Enrichment Programme is devised into six tailor-made sessions, exploring skills that sometimes are not explicitly addressed on the timetable. From team-building challenges to debating with other schools across the globe, we hope to enhance pupil employability through the additional skills acquired.

During the pandemic and beyond.

We were delighted to have introduced CENTURY, an artificial intelligence (AI)-powered learning platform, during the pandemic. Using the latest in AI, neuroscience and learning science, CENTURY personalises learning for each of our pupils – tailoring its library of teacher-created learning materials to their individual strengths, improvement areas and behaviours. CENTURY also saves our teachers hours of administrative work every week, freeing them up to focus on teaching, and enabling them the possibility of creating different learning opportunities for pupils, depending on what the pupil is experiencing at that moment in time.

Cognita recently conducted a listening exercise with pupils, parents, teachers and school leaders from various countries to gather opinions on the potential impact of AI tools, such as ChatGPT, on education. Their findings highlighted three key themes: Embracing AI: Participants acknowledged the positive potential of AI to significantly impact education. They believe that AI tools can enhance teaching and learning experiences, leading to more effective and personalised education. AI will not replace teachers: While AI can enhance education, participants agreed that it will not replace the role...
