Our Early Years Vision Statement.

We aim to support all our children by creating an environment that has a good balance of quality teaching and education, as well as opportunities for free and guided play experiences where the children choose and lead their learning.





St Clare's Early Years aims to

- Create a balance between child-initiated and adult-initiated activities to ensure that children acquire appropriate skills, knowledge and are cognitively challenged and supported.
- Ensure all children have access to indoor and outdoor play and learning experiences.
- Acknowledge the importance of play within the Early Years and ensure that opportunities for play activities are freely chosen. The nursery will help to ensure that play is fun and enjoyable for children.
- Use play to extend children's learning experiences.
- Monitor play, learning and progress through observation and recording.
- Monitor play, learning and progress to support and develop our planning.
- Review practices and resources to establish how children can best be supported in their play and learning.

The New Curriculum AT ST CLARE'S SCHOOL NURSERY

Our aim is for all children to develop the skills that will propel them into the future with confidence.

With an innovative new Early Years curriculum and outstanding level of care, your child will receive all the support they require to develop into curious, confident and rounded young people.

Literacy, numeracy and digital competency frameworks supplement and support the new curriculum to improve these key competencies in the classroom, and instil them as core skills from a young age.

The learning process in our nursery is carefully embedded into every session and by the time our children move on into Reception they have a true love of learning.

Authentic Learning experiences

St Clare's aims to teach children about their world and, where possible, create learning opportunities for them to experience activities with real life context.

5 Development Pathways I CLARE'S SCHOOL NURSERY

Central to the curriculum are the five key developmental pathways that are fundamental to the learning and development of all young children.

They focus on what is important for the child, and link closely to the key principles of child development.

Each pathway has a clear rationale that captures the essence of what children need to develop at their own pace in a way that is appropriate for them. The skills are child-centred and use statements that positively reflect the children recognising their progress, such as "I am learning to..." and "I need to...".

Butdoor Learning **ST CLARE'S SCHOOL NURSER**

St Clare's Early Years believes that outdoor play and learning is essential to children's health, development, and well-being. We aim to create opportunities for the children to play and learn outdoors regularly.

Our weekly Forest School promotes the opportunity to develop skills to manage risks and attempt new challenges which pupils would not face in a classroom. Such challenges include - using tools, building fires and den making. These activities add a sense of excitement and adventure to the children's learning, and they are free to explore and manipulate the environment around them using all their senses.

Our stunning woodland space is used for Forest School and as an outdoor classroom, providing the perfect place in which to develop a true appreciation for the natural world.

A large, secure astroturfed outdoor play area provides play facilities with slides, balance bikes, scooters and climbing frames to help the development of gross motor skills.





Room to Grow AT ST CLARE'S SCHOO

Few Nurseries in south Wales could compete with the exceptional facilities that are available to our pupils. Set in 11 acres of magnificent beautifully landscaped grounds, St Clare's School Nursery is the perfect environment for learning and personal growth.

Each classroom has an interactive smartboard and the children have access to iPads.

Benefitting from well-equipped, bright and comfortable rooms, plus a dedicated outdoor learning and play area, children can access the facilities they need to develop their academic, physical, social and creative skills.

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St Clare's School Nursery offers full-time or part-time places.

- Children can attend a combination of morning sessions and full days (with a minimum of 3 mornings to start in our Little Ladybirds class ("Rising 3s").
- Early drop off available from 8:00am for busy working parents.
- Morning sessions including lunch (9:00am-12:30pm).
- Full Time sessions (9:00am-3:00pm).
- After School Care from 3:30-5:30pm at no extra charge.





As parents you will rightly consider the cost of sending your child to private school nursery. We understand that parents want flexibility in the way they pay their fees. There are different options available to parents, from paying termly in advance by direct debit or if you would like even greater flexibility, monthly through the School Fee Plan.

- St Clare's Nursery is surprisingly competitively priced from as little as £46.56 per day (or £35.42 with the Bridgend Early Years Grant funding applied). A healthy home-cooked hot lunch and After School Club from 3:30
 - 5:30pm are included in the fees.
- Fees are charged per school term and there are 3 terms per year. Children living within Bridgend County Borough are eligible for the **Bridgend Early Years Grant Funding of £650 per term** from the term following their third birthday, provided they are in Nursery for a minimum of 3 mornings per week.
